Mexico – UNSDSN SDG Index Ranking

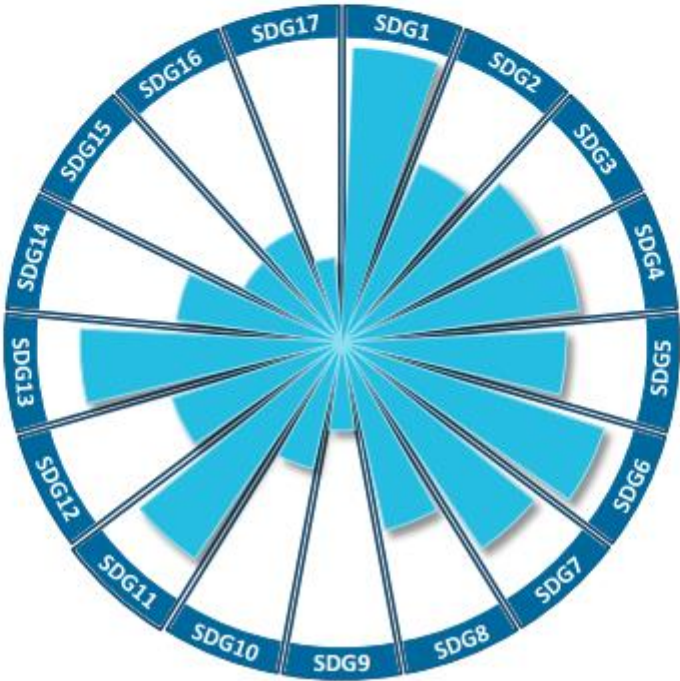

Mexico

- The Specialized Technical Committee on the SDGs (CTEODS) created in Feb 2016 to:
 - develop a work programme for SDG implementation
 - to revise & adjust indicators recommended by the UN to the Mexican context;
 - agree on the sources of information to be used for monitoring at national/subnational levels;
 - coordinate regular update of indicators & their publication as open data (SDGs National Platform);
 - manage the pilot, open source platform for the SDGs;
 - integrate progress reports & coordinate with other stakeholders.
- Advocates for a multi-stakeholder approach & has undertaken consultations with parliamentarians as well as others.

Mexico

- Key principles set out by the government:

- Rule of law
- Transparency
- Accountability
- Access to information
- Public participation
- Solid institutions
- Gender equality
- Non-discrimination
- Economic & social inclusion
- Resilience



Mexico

- Mexico co-chairs the global Inter-Agency and Expert Group on SDG Indicators.
- 180 out of 230 global indicators were mapped to different government agencies to be followed by the definition of national indicators by the National Institute of Statistics & Geography .
- Indicators used by the Ministry of Finance are being aligned to SDG Indicators to ensure proper budget allocation to support implementation.
- National Development Plan (PND 2013-2018), national programmes, structural reforms & coordination mechanisms were analysed for alignment with SDGs.

Mexico

- A parliamentary mechanism was set up to reform existing laws & regulations that contribute to achieving the SDGs.
- The Office of the President of Mexico tasked with drafting national implementation strategy for the SDGs.
- Mexican Agency for International Development Cooperation created *Partnership for Sustainability*, a platform for strategic collaboration with business in support of SDGs.

Mexico – Examples of what business can do

- Through the **Partnership for Sustainability Platform**, work with the government to exchange best practice on the **integration of SDGs into business models & design international cooperation projects** around the 2030 Agenda.
- **Collaborate with civil society**, as well as national, state & local governments in **developing tools to monitor results**.
- Set **emission reduction targets & reduce emissions** across your operations to support Mexico's ambitious climate policy.



- Develop **inclusive business models** to galvanize **innovation, strengthen value chains, open new market opportunities** while linking business strategy & new technologies with global priorities & challenges.
- Work with **sector peers** to **build capacity & define roadmaps** to mainstream sustainable practices in your industry & beyond.
